This term the Year 5's take a deep dive into the colonial history of Australia.



Classrooms will complete 'circle times', giving students the opportunity to talk about their worries leading into camp and discuss the coping mechanisms when they feel worried about being away from their family.

MATHEMATICS

Time, Statistics, Length, Area, Capacity, Angles

Mathematics this term involves a magnitude of learning cycles, even though we are going on camp and Arts week is thrown in the mix! Students engage in many hands-on experiences through all areas of learning as they complete a vast majority of games involving an array of manipulatives. Students will have plenty of learning opportunities both indoors and out. Our measurement unit takes on many elements that require students to measure, weigh, compare and justify findings.

LITERACY

Writing, Spelling, Reading and Speaking and Listening

The majority of our Literacy content this term connects to our Inquiry which is 'Australian History'. Students learn how to complete a biography based on a famous Australian from the past. Students have the opportunity to learn about many well known Australians prior to researching a person of their choice. On the completion of their biographies, students will share their knowledge to the rest of the class. Learning then moves into poetry, again with the focus on history. During Literacy this time we look into the history of words and the meaning of words, not only from our whole school spelling scope and sequence but from the vocabulary we come across in Inquiry too. Students will have the opportunity to complete History quiz at the end of the term and present a speech on a famous explorer.



RELIGION Promise

Year 5 students explore the concept 'Promise' The 'Promise' offered to the People of God, from earliest biblical times in the story of Abraham through to today, is the major theme of this unit and reveals God's deep hope and abiding love for humanity. An eighty year old man (Abraham), still living in his father's tent is called by God to get up and follow! As a result of Abraham, Sarah and others we have the three great monotheistic (believing in one God) faiths; Judaism, Christianity and Islam.
